CHOOSING A TREE

These are trees that we feel are well suited to our environment:

Little Leaf Linden – *Tilila cordata*

American Basswood – *Tilia americana*

Green Ash – *Fraxinus pennsylvanica*

White Ash – *Fraxinus americana*

Manchurian Ash – *Fraxinus mandshurica*

Elm – *Ulmus spp*

Silver Maple – *Acer saccharinum*

Red Maple – *Acer rubrum*

Amur Maple – *Acer ginnala*

Manitoba Maple – *Acer negundo*

Pin Oak – *Quercus ellipsoidalis*

Bur Oak – *Quercus macrocarpa*

Paper Birch – *Betula papyrifera*

Japanese Tree Lilac – *Syringa reticulata*

Hawthorne – *Crataegus x mordenesis*



These trees can withstand our winters as well as our summers. This list offers a variety of shapes, sizes and colours to add to the landscaping of your home and neighbourhood. WHEN WILL MY TREES ARRIVE?

Trees will be ordered in the spring for spring delivery. Have your application in no later than March 31st and your trees will be made available sometime in May or June. By accepting the tree(s), you are accepting responsibility to care for the tree(s) for the first 3 years. You will be responsible for the planting, watering and general care of the tree(s). After the first 3 years, the boulevard trees become the sole responsibility of the City.

At pick up, you will be given instructions on how to plant the tree(s). The Parks & Recreation Dept. will do follow-up calls to check on the trees.

BOULEVARDS

The City of Moose Jaw has three kinds of boulevards; green space located between the street and the sidewalk, green space located between the sidewalk and the property line and the green space located in the centre medians of major streets. These boulevards create a more pleasant urban environment.

No construction, cultivation or alteration of a boulevard area may be done without the consent of the Parks and Recreation Department.

According to Section 3.(1) of City of Moose Jaw Bylaw 4760:

3.(1) "The owner or occupant of any property abutting a boulevard shall be responsible for the general care and maintenance of such boulevard area including cutting grass, keeping clear of weeds and litter, and maintaining a neat appearance This section also applies to shrubs and hedges on boulevards.

WHAT TREES CAN DO FOR YOUR NEIGHBOURHOOD AND FOR OUR CITY

Trees provide many benefits, such as:

- Reduce cooling and heating costs
- Filter air pollution
- Generate oxygen, absorb CO2 and other harmful pollutants
- Increase property values
- Reduce storm water run-off and the cost of water treatment
- Provide habitat for birds and other fauna
- Add living beauty to your neighbourhood
